The Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) has updated the data sharing code of practice in line with the changes to data protection legislation. The draft code of practice is open for consultation until 9th September 2019.

[ICO FOI Decision Notice: South East Coast Ambulance Service NHS Foundation Trust /FS50804762/](#)
The Information Commissioner has found that South East Coast Ambulance Service NHS Foundation Trust were correct in withholding information relating to suspected illegal drug use by staff at the trust by citing the exemption under section 40(2) of the FOIA (third party personal data). The Commissioner found that the data withheld related to and identifies a number of individuals and therefore fell within the definition of 'personal data' in section 3(2) of the Data Protection Act 2018.

[ICO FOI Decision Notice: London Borough of Barking and Dagenham /FS50806191/](#)
The Information Commissioner has found that the London Borough of Barking and Dagenham were correct in finding that the section 43(2) (commercial interests) FOIA exemption was engaged in relation to a request for copies of various electricity supplier bills for a particular property, and that in the circumstances of this case the public interest favoured the withholding the information.
