Reason for Change

There has been long-standing confusion in the NHS Wales Data Dictionary over the definitions and use of Main Specialty, Local Sub-Specialty and Treatment Function Codes.

To more clearly distinguish between 'Main Specialty' and 'Treatment Function Code', two separate lists and accompanying definitions (based on those used in England) are to be introduced.

The NHS Wales Data Dictionary does not properly distinguish between 'Main Specialty' being a Royal Colleges and Faculties approved title and 'Treatment Function' being a division of clinical work based on Main Specialty.

Therefore a clear, distinct definition of Main Specialty (Consultant) is to be introduced into the NHS Wales Data Dictionary.

Description of Change

To introduce a new definition for 'Main Specialty (Consultant)' to more accurately describe its content. The English Definition of Main Specialty is to be adopted.

This is the main specialty of the Consultant. It is a unique identifier for a specialty function. A specialty function is a division of clinical work to a lower level than that designated by Royal Colleges and Facilities.

Specialties are divisions of clinical work which may be defined by body systems (e.g. dermatology), age (e.g. paediatrics), clinical technology (e.g. nuclear medicine), clinical function (e.g. rheumatology), group of diseases (e.g. oncology) or combinations of these factors.

Only specialty titles recognised by the Royal Colleges and Faculties should be used. This list is maintained by the General and Specialist Medical Practice (Education, Training and Qualifications) Order 2003 and European Primary and Specialist Dental Qualifications Regulations 1998.
