Subject: The introduction of valid period date ranges for data items within the

Reason for Change: To assist NHS Trusts in Wales with the submission of valid codes.

Implementation Date: Immediately

Background:

The Data Quality Improvement Project (DQIP) was initiated within the Corporate Health Information Programme (CHIP) in March 2007 following the approval of the Data Quality Accountability Framework¹ by the CHIP Board in September 2006. It set out seven guiding principles that should be followed. These are:

- Data providers are responsible for their data quality;
- Any 'cleansing' required is only undertaken when the data provider has signed off the process that their data will be subjected to, thereby retaining accountability for data quality;
- All patient-level data sets will have a set of data quality standards agreed which will then be used for reporting purposes;
- These data quality standards will be based on the Data Accreditation standards, where available, otherwise they will be developed in consultation with the service;
- Aggregate data sets will be reviewed to determine where data quality checks could be developed;
- Health Solutions Wales (HSW) will publish data quality reports based on these standards on a regular basis, which will be easily accessed via the Health of Wales Information Service (HOWIS);
- Procedures for ensuring the accuracy of data will be developed through discussion with the Wales Audit Office (WAO) and Welsh Risk Pool (WRP).

The DQIP aims to establish firmly these principles with the intention of securing long-term improvements in data quality, acknowledging that that all those with a role in defining information requirements, collecting, processing and analysing data have a role in data quality.

As part of the initial phase of the DQIP, a range of data validity standards were developed for the Admitted Patient Care (APC) data set. During the implementation of the standards and the associated monitoring mechanisms required to support them, it became apparent that the

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Validation Dictionary², the NHS Wales Data Dictionary, reference data³ and Code Mapper⁴ required updating to ensure compliance with the Data Validity Standards, mandated via WHC (2008) 007 effective 1st April 2008.

A series of analyses was undertaken to establish which codes were being submitted within the APC data set and this highlighted the use of codes that were no longer valid across Welsh NHS Trusts. On detailed examination of the NHS Wales Data Dictionary, it was noted that historical code changes made in the past were not reflected in the dictionary. Following consultation with the service, it was recommended that these changes be reflected in future releases of the NHS Wales Data Dictionary. This will ensure that the NHS Wales Data Dictionary comprehensively outlines all the code values and their valid to/from dates in order to assist NHS Trusts in their provision of valid APC data.

The Validation dictionary, Code Mapper categories and reference data have already been updated and this document highlights the changes required in the NHS Wales Data Dictionary. The historic codes for all data items used within the APC data set have been checked back to Version 1.1 of the NHS Wales Data Dictionary, with all codes valid before this version being highlighted as pre 28th December 1995.

Actions Required:

Trusts are required to ensure that the data items they submit for APC are valid.

² Validation Dictionary is a data base tool used to store all Structured Query Language (SQL) scripts, comments and descriptions for the Load and Validation at Source (VAS) checks linked to all submitted data sets.

³ Reference Data is the listing of all individual person codes and their linking organisation codes along with addresses and postcodes.

⁴ Code Mapper is a subset of reference data and is a data base tool used to map values and their date ranges to existing data items within specified data sets.
