DATA SET CHANGE NOTICE

<u>Introduction</u>

A range of data validity standards have been developed for the Outpatient Referrals Data Set (OPR DS). These were mandated via Official Letter (PMW/THOMAS/BS/OPR) effective from 1st April 2010. During the development work associated with their implementation, a problem with the unique key used to identify individual OPR records was identified whereby it was possible for one organisation to unintentionally overwrite the record of another organisation if they utilised an identical 'Referral Identifier' code.

In order to uniquely identify an individual OPR record, the 'Referral Identifier' must be viewed in combination with the 'Organisation Code (Code of Provider)'. The infrastructure enabling records to be loaded onto the OPR national database needs to be updated to reflect this requirement so as to prevent any further instances of records being incorrectly overwritten.

Description of Change

To update the unique key for OPR data to ensure OPR records could be uniquely identified within the OPR DS.

Data Dictionary Version

This DSCN will be reflected in version 3.2 of the NHS Wales Data Dictionary

Actions Required

Actions for Health Solutions Wales and Business Services Centre (part of the NHS Wales Informatics Service):-

Update the Generic Data Load (GDL) infrastructure of OPR data to ensure OPR records are
uniquely identified using the 'Referral Identifier' and 'Organisation Code (Code of Provider)' in
combination.

There are no actions for Local Health Boards / Trusts at this stage.
