#### DATA SET CHANGE NOTICE

### <u>Introduction</u>

The 1983 Mental Health Act covers the compulsory admission and detention in hospital of mentally disordered persons; it provides the legal framework for their care and treatment, and includes matters relating to care outside of hospital settings. The 1983 Act was amended by the Mental Health Act 2007.

Following amendment to the Mental Health Act 1983 (the 1983 Act) there have been changes to legal status and mental category. These need to be reflected in the Psychiatric Census and Admitted Patient Care data sets so that the data will provide a correct record for the mental health patients admitted to hospital. However, changes in the permissible values in relevant data items in data sets are only now being reflected. In the period between the legislative change and the implementation date of this DSCN, old and new values will be accepted in APC submissions. For the Psychiatric Census these changes will only be introduced from March 2011.

## Description of Change

To update the data items 'Legal Status' and 'Mental Category' in Admitted Patient Care Data Set and Psychiatric Census Return.

# Data Dictionary Version

This DSCN will be reflected in version 3.3 of the NHS Wales Data Dictionary.

## Actions Required

#### Actions for Local Health Boards / Trust:

#### Admitted Patient Care Data Set

- Must ensure changes are implemented from the May 2011 submission (i.e. April 2011 data) of APC data.
- Health Boards may decide to resubmit historical data to reflect the legislative change date if they so wish.

### **Psychiatric Census**

- Ensure changes are implemented from March 2011 Census.



### Actions for NHS Wales Informatics Service Brunel House

### Admitted Patient Care Data Set

 Update the Validation at Source Service (VASS) to reflect changes described in this DSCN by 30<sup>th</sup> April 2011.

### **Psychiatric Census**

- Update the national Psychiatric Census database to allow for changes to Psychiatric Census to be submitted from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2011 onwards.

Changes to the NHS Wales Data Dictionary are detailed below, with new text being highlighted in **blue** and deletions are shown with a **strikethrough.** The text shaded in **grey** shows existing text copied from the NHS Wales Data Dictionary.

## **Legal Status**

This is a classification of a patient's legal status which is either informal or as designated in the Mental Health Act 1983 or other acts. The classification "informal" is used for those patients who are not formally detained or not receiving supervised aftercare. The classification is required for all patients who have a hospital provider spell which includes the care of a Consultant in the psychiatric specialties or have been discharged from such a hospital provider spell and are required to receive supervised aftercare under the provision of the Mental Health (Patients in the Community) Act 1995.

For the APC ds99 this data item became effective from April 1999 and, with the data item Administrative Category, replaced the data item Category of Patient.
