Age

Where age is measured in years, this refers to whole years e.g. a patient or client aged 19 years and 11 months would be counted as 19 years old.

For KO36

Age on admission to the home

Dual Registration

Homes that are registered both with the Local Health Board as nursing homes under Section 23 of the Registered Homes Act and with the Local Authority as residential care homes under Section 5 of the (Registered Homes) Act, whether or not the patients/residents are housed in the same building or in separate accommodation or on a single site.

Permanent Resident

Resident

The term resident is used in two different ways:

a)	To refer to any person whose usual place of residence lies within the relevant administrative boundary. e.g. A resident is any person who, on the last day of the relevant financial year, lives within the administrative boundary of the LHB regardless of where that person may have been immunised or normally be treated.
b)	To refer to any person residing i.e. normally occupying a bed at a particular site e.g. a hospital or a nursing home at a certain date.

For KO36

Short stay resident: any person for whom the home is intended to provide a holiday or temporary care e.g. whilst their relations or those who normally care for them are on holiday, in hospital etc.

Permanent resident: any person normally resident.

Includes:	
a)	Those temporarily absent because of



	holidays etc.
b)	Any residents who were admitted on a short stay basis but who remained in the home as permanent residents.
Excludes:	
a)	Short stay residents
b)	Day cases.

Supported resident: a resident who's financing is provided by a local authority (after 1 April 1993) and/or DSS (income support).

Excludes:	
a)	Those who only have services e.g. social work supervision provided by the local authority.
b)	Those who have other DSS benefits which are put towards their maintenance e.g. retirement pension or attendance allowance.

Medical staff (resident): in residence for three nights or more per week.

Nursing staff: in post as at 31 March. Each nurse should be recorded once only according to the qualification of the specialty for which employed (i.e. the qualification appropriate to the major part of the nurse's duties).

NB: If it is not possible to provide this information for 31 March the return should be completed on the basis of the last visit to the hospital. In this event it should be stated on the return under Part 5 on Special Factors.
Include:

a)	Those on the payroll who at that date were temporarily absent through sickness, annual leave, study, etc.
b)	Agency staff filling a permanent post (i.e. not covering for sickness, leave, study etc.).



Other nursing staff: include nurses with qualifications not listed elsewhere e.g. nursery nurses, fever nurses.

Standard Whole Time Equivalents (WTEs): calculated by dividing the weekly hours of the full-time or part-time post by the "standard" NHS week of 37.5 contracted hours.
