DATA SET CHANGE NOTICE

Introduction

The Child Measurement Programme (CMP) is a national programme of child height and weight measurement in Wales. It involves a standardised approach to the collection, recording, collation and analysis of data on child height and weight across Wales. This will allow for the improved quality of child measurement data in Wales, which is currently collected by LHBs across Wales, but not in a uniform manner.

The purpose of the programme is to develop robust, high quality data to monitor population prevalence of underweight, overweight and obesity, at a both a national and local level. This is a key component of Welsh Government policy and supported by 'The Child Measurement Programme (Wales) Regulations 2011'.

This development builds on existing national information systems for child health information, in particular the National Community Child Health System (NCCHD) and its existing links with Community Child Health 2000 Systems (CCH2000), which is used by all service providers in Wales. Data is currently extracted from the local CCH2000 systems to the National Community Child Health Database.

This DSCN outlines a set of Child Measurement data requirements, which have been defined by the CMP. These requirements will need to be incorporated into any changes made to the CCH2000 systems. To this aim, a Child Measurement module has been developed to enable relevant staff to input their Child Measurement Data. Details on data entry can be found in the User Guide.

As part of routine health surveillance, all relevant staff involved in delivering the Child Measurement Programme (nursing, child health and managerial staff) are required to collect and report the information described in this DSCN, and in accordance with the <u>'Standards for Implementing the Child Measurement Programme for Wales (2012/13)</u>'.

Description of Change

To introduce the Child Measurement Programme Data Requirements.

Data Dictionary Version

Where applicable, this DSCN reflects changes introduced by DSCN and/or DDCN since the release of version 4.5 of the NHS Wales Data Dictionary.

The changes introduced by such DSCNs will be published in version 4.6 of the NHS Wales Data Dictionary.

Actions Required

Actions for Local Health Boards:

• Ensure that the relevant staff continue to collect the information required as set out in this DSCN and in accordance with guidance issued through the document 'Standards for Implementing the Child Measurement Programme for Wales (2012/13)'.

 Information should be recorded in the Child Measurement Module of the Child Health 2000 System as soon as possible, ideally no later than one month after measures are taken. All results are to be entered by 31st August in the academic year of measurement.

Actions for NHS Wales Informatics Service:

- Ensure that the Child Measurement Module is accessible across all Local Child Health Systems to enable input of data.
- Extract quarterly data from local Child Health 2000 systems to the National Community Child Health Database (NCCHD).
- Provide a quarterly report of Child Measurement Programme data to Welsh Government and other relevant external bodies.

Child Measurement Programme Data

The following information is required to be collected by all relevant health professionals involved in delivering the Child Measurement Programme (nursing, child health and managerial staff).
